E Source Reports Performance of Electric and Gas Utility Web Sites

BOULDER, Colo., November 7, 2005—E Source reported its latest benchmark results for the performance of U.S. electric and gas company web sites. Most utility web sites provide online services and are easy to use. However, some utility web sites are struggling to keep up with the increased demand of electric and gas customers for online services that are easy to find and easy to use.

As electric and gas companies offer more online customer services, the customer's experience becomes even more important to the success and use of these services. To gauge how successful electric and gas company web sites are in serving their residential customers, E Source reviewed the web sites of 105 U.S. electric and gas companies from the customer's point of view. Between May 2004 and June 2005, four typical residential energy customers looked for and rated 27 predetermined online features and functions. These features and functions were chosen based on E Source market research data showing the information and self-service functions residential customers want to find and use on their utility web site.

The top-rated electric and gas web sites in the U.S. are provided by Portland General Electric, Kansas City Power & Light, Duke Power, Florida Power & Light, and Sacramento Municipal Utility District.

The E Source review is the largest and most in-depth benchmark of electric and gas web sites. The first benchmark study was completed in 2002, when most utility sites simply provided information to visitors. Today customers are using online services and completing transactions. Many utilities assessed within the review provided the E Source research team with temporary access to assess the online services.

Florence Connally, an E Source senior research associate, observed that "web sites are constantly evolving, but so are customer expectations of the sites they visit. To keep up with customer expectations, electric and gas company web sites must now offer online account management features such as bill payment, bill presentment, and even account balance information."

Andrew Heath, director of E Source Customer Satisfaction Services, commented that "highly rated web sites were not necessarily the prettiest. Best were the sites that offer the online features and functions that customers want and are also easy to use."

Eastern Region

Long Island Power Authority, Public Service New Hampshire, and PEPCO have the best three web sites in the Eastern region.

Midwestern Region

Kansas City Power & Light, Wisconsin Public Service, and Cinergy/PSI provide the three best web sites in the Midwest. Also performing well in the region are Xcel Energy, Alliant Energy, We Energies, MidAmerican, and Cinergy/CG&E.

Southern Region

Duke Power, Florida Power & Light, and Progress Energy provide the three best web sites in the Southern region. Also performing well in the region are Reliant Energy and City Public Service.

Western Region

Portland General Electric, Sacramento Municipal Utility District, and Arizona Public Service provide the best three web sites in the Western region. Customers in the West are fortunate to be served by many of the top-performing companies in the review. Also performing well are NW Natural, Avista Utilities, Southern California Gas, Salt River Project, Southern California Edison, and Puget Sound Energy.
