Your nose will let you know if there's a gas leak.



NATURAL GAS: YOU CAN'T SEE IT OR TASTE IT SO WE MADE SURE YOU CAN SMELL IT.

A harmless substance called mercaptan is added to natural gas to make it smell like rotten eggs or sulphur. So if there's a gas leak, you'll know it right away. Smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms will not pick up on it. But your nose will.

What to do if you smell that smell:

- 1 Get everyone out of the home and away from the property immediately.
- 2 Call **911** or Union Gas at **1-877-969-0999** from outside or a neighbour's home.
Do not call from inside your home or garage.
- 3 Don't use electrical switches, appliances, lighters or matches and do not smoke.
- 4 Don't start any motors or motor vehicles on the property.

No energy source is safer or more reliable than natural gas.

Leaks are rare, but if one does occur, you need to know what to do to keep your home and family safe. Make sure everyone in your household is aware of the smell and what it means.

If you notice a rotten egg or sulphur smell
get everyone out before you call 911. ▶
